Pay attention to what you engage with and the qualities that you are being exposed to through your conversations, activities, entertainment, or even your own thoughts. Do they reflect the qualities in Philippians 4:8, or not? As a result, do they make you feel "at home" in God's presence, or more like you're wandering in exile?

In this final video on the theme of sin, we talk about how we can respond in the event that we do make a mistake and sin. Paulie sums it up perfectly when describing the heart of our Good Father...He cares more about the relationship than the incident. Instead of turning away from God because of the guilt we feel, He wants us to turn toward Him knowing that there we will find grace, forgiveness, and help for whatever we are facing.

Let's Discuss...

- When you know you've sinned, what is your usual go to response? How does that help or hurt you?
- Jonny mentions how the Bible says that David, despite all his mistakes and failures, was described as a man after God's own heart. Why do you think the Bible describes Him this way even though he committed such grievous sins?
- Jonny also talks about how one thing that David did not do was to worship other gods.
 Read Exodus 34:14. How does it make you feel to know that God is jealous for your worship and affection?
